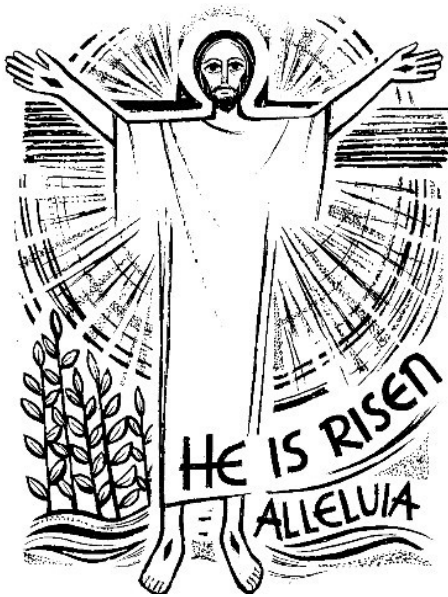

Women church planters reach new disciples

In celebration of Women's History Month, Interpreter highlights two contemporary women church planters.

Hope Community Church, Claymont, Delaware

The Rev. Amy Louise Peters probably never dreamed she would be a church planter.

Raised in the Roman Catholic Church, she graduated from parochial schools. Peters says she became a United Methodist because her husband, Mark, "was willing to go back to church with me if I would attend the church of his youth." They began attending Hillcrest-Bellefonte United Methodist Church in Wilmington, Delaware, where she found helpful mentors.

"A United Methodist pastor, who counseled us before marriage, took time to explain all the things in common with the Catholic beliefs," Peters says. "He built that bridge for me long before I ever thought I would cross it.

"Of greatest importance to me, the grace of God touched my heart and soul in that United Methodist church. Every time I attended, I felt peace and acceptance by God that I had never experienced before. Although it was an older congregation, their love and prayers helped me put my past behind me, and I become the new creation in Christ that God had intended for me."

Then, she explains, "God moved us to Atonement United Methodist Church in Claymont, Delaware."

Fast forward a few years. A desire "to offer a nontraditional site for

worship for persons uncomfortable or withdrawn from a traditional church setting" led Peters to help plant Hope Community Church on the border of Claymont and northern Wilmington.

At the same time, 147-year-old Atonement, Hope's "mother church," was experiencing significant growth with its contemporary worship service.

Hope Church opened its doors in September 2013 with about 30 members from Atonement Church. Since then, Hope has had at least 300 people visit. In 2014, weekly worship attendance averaged 50. "It has grown because we never stop trying to get the word out!" Peters says. "Our goal for 2015 is to have 100 worshipers as we celebrate Christmas."

Church members are "socio-economically varied but mostly middle and lower class," she says.

Seed money came from the church development corporation of the Peninsula-Delaware Annual Conference.

Today the Hope and Atonement churches blend study and service as they provide combined young adult, youth and women's ministries; service projects; discipleship (Life Groups and Bible studies); and a community service day.

Peters has served Atonement for 14 years. As a layperson for the first 10, she was the Christian education director and youth and young adult leader as well as a certified lay speaker. For the past four years, since answering the call to ordained ministry, Peters

has been the assistant pastor and is now pastor to the Hope congregation.

Church planting," she says, "is like night and day from other types of ministries that I have been involved in. It is so multifaceted, and I am grateful for my many years of experience in different areas of servant leadership that proved invaluable. Church planting is intensely administrative, pastoral and relational. It has stretched me beyond my wildest expectations."

Peters cherishes her adopted church.

"The United Methodist Church has so much I find appealing," she says. "John Wesley was a genius, and I am in love with his unique perspective on God's amazing grace as well as the means of grace for spiritual growth. I especially appreciate the importance of relationship with Christ Jesus and one another, discipleship, evangelism, mission and justice. We have an awesome denomination.

"Every Sunday, I am reduced to tears of joy to see all the new faces at Hope as well as the returning ones that are hungry for hope, thirsty for the word and willing to reach out with the great, good news of Jesus Christ."

Scholarships are Available for High School Seniors and College Students

If you are a high school senior who will be going to college, or if you are already enrolled at a school of higher learning, this is your opportunity to apply for the M. Evelyn Frey Memorial Scholarship or the Memorial Scholarship provided by Atonement Church.

Applications and directions are available in the Welcome Center. There are separate directions, depending on whether you are a high school or college student. The committee **MUST** receive the completed application and supporting materials no later than Monday, April 27, 2015. Applications are to be placed in the mailbox of Danee Kennedy, found in the Welcome Center.

The Scholarship Committee would like to bring to the attention of prospective applicants some of the criteria listed for each scholarship. Items common to both funds are:

1. Applicant must be a member of Atonement Church.
2. Recipient must be enrolled in a post high school program.
3. Recipient will be expected to complete an application personally.
4. Special consideration will be given to students who are active in various church programs.
5. All awards will be paid directly to the institution of higher learning.

Additional criteria for the M. Evelyn Frey Scholarship Fund:

1. The award must be to confirmed members of the church.
2. Those who indicated they are seriously interested in pursuing a vocation leading to the ordained ministry shall have the highest priority for the scholarship. This requires an endorsement from the current pastor. Persons pursuing other forms of church vocation shall have second priority.
3. While not peremptory, strong consideration will be given to academic achievement, service activities (especially within the church), and financial need.

Additional criteria for the Atonement Scholarship Fund:

1. Recipient and his/her family must be members of Atonement Church.
2. High school senior applicants must be in the upper one-third of the graduating class. He/she also must exhibit involvement in extra-curricular activities with an emphasis on church and community service that emphasizes meeting human needs.

PERFECTIONISM BY REV. CONSTANCE HASTINGS

As United Methodists, we know in the historic examination for those who would be deacons or elder in our connection, the bishop asks this question, "Are you going on to perfection?" Theologically, a candidate must reflect on his or her life journey in Christ and what God through the Holy Spirit intends for this person, especially in ministry. But for the average person, such a question may be construed to imply that expectations of the church and thus of God do not allow for mistakes of any kind. From there, emotional issues can grow and lead to feelings of unworthiness, anxiety and guilt, among others.

Perfectionism is a desire for excellence in some or many areas of life, but it also can carry the weight of fear of being judged by others such as parents, employers, friends or anyone who is perceived as watching over a person's shoulder, sometimes even God. While striving for excellence in school, athletics, or work is certainly encouraged and highly valued, there must be a balance in understanding standards must be reachable. The realization must be that it's ok to be among the best but not being the best is no real failure.

It's likely no surprise that perfectionist personalities are often formed during childhood. Over achieving parents may set very high expectations in the home, and unless they are sensitive to the child's emotional need to be accepted even when not perfect or just average, the child

may develop issues surrounding his or her self-worth. In a similar vein, if there is major dysfunction in the home such as violence or addiction, the child may feel the need to be the "perfect one" who never causes trouble in the family. Regardless of its source, perfectionism can lead to emotional issues and scarring that last a long time.

To combat these tendencies, a reversal or change in self-talk may be necessary. Thoughts such as, "People will probably think less of me if I make a mistake" or "I will never be loved if I am a failure," need to be refuted. Parents especially should be affirming of a child's achievements that are less than the best while encouraging that trying again and learning from one's mistakes is of great value.

If you or loved ones have unrealistic expectations of themselves that cause anxiety, depression or related issues such as eating disorders or self-medication through drug use, professional help through counseling or psychiatric care is a necessary component to finding health and the ability to live without the fear of always being judged.

Finally, the bishop always follows the question on perfection with, "Do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life?" The source of that love is found in our God who gave everything through Jesus Christ that we may have abundant and eternal life. There is nothing that we can do to earn that love but

just accept it in the creation that we are made and live in the power of the Holy Spirit. What more perfect love can there be but that?

"I have loved you with an everlasting love." Jeremiah 31:3

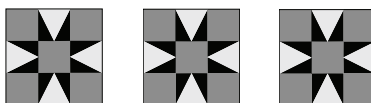

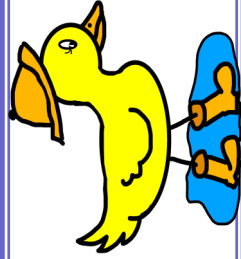

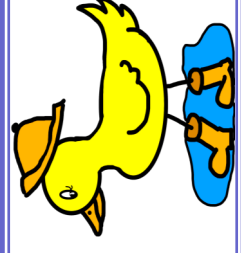
