Atonement Methodist Church



(From "The Churches of Delaware" by Frank R. Zebley - 1947)

At Claymont, was an outgrowth of Sunday School organized, in 1864, in a room over Frank Ford's grocery store which stood opposite the present Naaman's Tea House. At a meeting held on June 2, 1866, it was decided to build a church. Thomas Kimber, a Quaker, donated the site on June 7, 1866 and subscribed \$2500.00 toward the building. The church was dedicated during the following November. In 1885, the Sunday School was built.

After major improvements, reopening services were held on July 24, 1898, with Pres. Elder Robert Watt in charge. The church was damaged in the storm of Mar. 1, 1914. A large addition to house the Sunday School was built in 1927. The corner-stone was laid on the afternoon of June 26, 1927, by the Rev. J.W. Colona. The silver trowel was to be encased in glass and placed in the vestibule of the church. The dedication services were held on Nov. 13, 1927. Memorial windows were installed in 1940. A new Moller pipe-organ was dedicated on June 22, 1941. During the 75th Anniversary celebration on Nov. 16, a grove of trees, to be planted in honor of Thomas Kimber, the Quaker, was presented to the trustees.

A new chancel was built and it was used for the first time on Sun., June 17, 1945. The chancel and a large number of memorial gifts were dedicated on Sun., July 1, 1945, by Dist. Supt. Dr. Oliver J. Collins, assisted by the pastor, the Rec. Preston W. Spence, Jr.



VOICES BY REV. CONSTANCE HASTINGS

"The light shines through the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it."

John 1:5 (NLT)

A recent college graduate, William Stride had a bright life and future before him in 1990. Intelligent and with a good family background, he seemed destined to productive work in society as a promising young man. Life should have gone well for him.

But when intrusive voices began to command him to punch out innocent strangers, anxiety and paranoia took over. Thus began a lifelong journey of living with mental illness, specifically a diagnosis of schizophrenia. It rerouted his life from hopes of graduate school and normal relationships with friends and family to years in treatment at state mental hospitals, halfway houses and group homes.

Voices Inside Me: A Personal Recovery Account of from Schizophrenia (2015) chronicles Stride as he learned about his illness and the necessary steps it takes to recover a life that can be fulfilling given with what he lives. Through the ups and downs of mental illness, he needed to come to a realization that this would never just go away, and consistent, lifetime medication is just as necessary to his well being as it would be to someone with high blood pressure and diabetes. Characteristically shy, he had to learn that while institutional life seemed to infringe on his personal freedoms, the social interaction and supervision of care givers were just as necessary as his medication. Mental illness causes many changes of perception of oneself, changes which Stride learned from in his failures as much as his successes. Whether it occurred running from the police or escapes from psychiatric hospitals, his attempts at various jobs, his intuitive sense of which persons were dangerous for him, Stride grows as he details his memory of these incidences.

Interestingly, what also grows is his gratitude for each person who affirms his humanity with kindness and fairness. With such encounters, he often describes the joy he experiences in hope that the chaotic thoughts can be stilled, and he has a purpose in not only finding his own healing but can become an advocate for others with mental illness.

While this is a secular book, there also are points in which he reaches through prayer and Bible reading for comfort and peace. At Christmas, he makes an effort to not just celebrate the season, but to remember the real meaning of Jesus' birth, the coming of The Light of the World to dispel that which would keep others from living lives of wholeness through healing. Though not one to find a place in church, he does find in his belief in God a wonder that is found and expressed in his study of astronomy, the celestial bodies set in place and motion by the Creator.

If God as Creator could order the universe, then God can also help those with mental illness find order within. Voices Inside Me by William Stride is a story of recovery and hope. It is available through Amazon.

Daybreak Counseling Services is a nonprofit clinical pastoral counseling agency that not only addresses the presenting issue or problem but also allows for the inclusion of spirituality within sessions. It is supported through payments determined on a sliding scale basis, private grants, and individual donations. Rev. Constance Hastings, a nationally certified counselor and United Methodist deacon, sees clients at St. Paul's and Atonement United Methodist Churches with both day and evening hours. 
