Our series during Lent is "Lead Us to the Cross" and one of the early verses that we used was taken from I Corinthians 1:18, "For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God."

Last time that we were in Israel we went to the place where Jesus was crucified. It tells us that it was called Golgotha, (the place of the skull) when standing along the road you can see on the rocks a figure of a skull. There really is no mistaking it. It is also within walking distance of what is believed to be the tomb of Jesus. It is all very clear, it is all very easy to see. Standing there looking at the place where Jesus died is very moving.

People had asked me the last time that I was there what my favorite places was to visit while in Israel. For me it was the boat ride on the sea of Galilee, and the other was the "Garden Tomb" where Jesus was buried.

As we journey together in this season of Lent I am reminded of these sites that we visited while in Israel, but it will mean more to me this trip because of the series of messages that we have been preaching about. You do not have to go to Israel to appreciate this series, because we have the Bible that teaches us so much about the Cross.


As we are being led to the cross in this season of Lent, may God reveal to us the great work that was done on the cross by our savior Jesus the Christ?

Black History Month

In February, we pause, remember, and honor Black Americans for their accomplishments and contributions to the historic timeline of American history. Once a week long celebration created by historian Carter G. Woodson in 1926 and called "Negro History Week", it was officially recognized and expanded to a month long observance in 1976 to the present day. This change allowed "Black History month" and it's events to emphasized the teaching of black history while being reflective through stimulated discussions, educational programs and community involvement in public schools, universities and museums.

"We should emphasize not Negro History, but the Negro in history. What we need is not a history of selected races or nations, but the history of the world void of national bias, race hate, and religious prejudice." -Dr. Carter G. Woodson

With the month chosen to coincide with the birthdays of President Abraham Lincoln and abolitionist Frederick Douglas, paying tribute to black achievements increased the awareness of the courage and perseverance of black citizens contributions to life and culture in the U.S. The collective accounts of the struggles and societal changes throughout the decades, gave all citizens an opportunity to learn national and world history.

" Seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history."- President Gerald Ford

As believers in Christ, we all have been placed on this earth, regardless of race or culture, to reflect God's image and love. Our differences give us the opportunity to see God's plan at work as we embrace and live the Christian faith. The spiritual heritage that we share binds us together. 

High School Seniors and College Students

If you are a high school senior who will be going to college, or if you are already enrolled at a school of higher learning, this is your opportunity to apply for the M. Evelyn Frey Memorial Scholarship or the Memorial Scholarship provided by Atonement Church.

Applications and directions are available in the Welcome Center. There are separate directions, depending on whether you are a high school or college student. The committee MUST receive the completed application and supporting materials no later than Monday, April 25, 2016. Applications are to be placed in the mailbox of Danee Kennedy, found in the Welcome Center.

The Scholarship Committee would like to bring to the attention of prospective applicants some of the criteria listed for each scholarship. Items common to both funds are:

- 1. Applicant must be a member of Atonement Church.
- 2. Recipient must be enrolled in a post high school program.
- 3. Recipient will be expected to complete an application personally.
- 4. Special consideration will be given to students who are active in various church programs.
- 5. All awards will be paid directly to the institution of higher learning. Additional criteria for the M. Evelyn Frey Scholarship Fund:
- 6. The award must be to confirmed members of the church.
- 7. Those who indicated they are seriously interested in pursuing a vocation leading to the ordained ministry shall have the highest priority for the scholarship. This requires an endorsement from the current pastor. Persons pursuing other forms of church vocation shall have second priority.
- 8. While not peremptory, strong consideration will be given to academic achievement, service activities (especially within the church), and financial need.

Additional criteria for the Atonement Scholarship Fund:

- 1. Recipient and his/her family must be members of Atonement Church.
- 2. High school senior applicants must be in the upper one-third of the graduating class. He/she also must exhibit involvement in extracurricular activities with an emphasis on church and community service that emphasizes meeting human needs.
