From Pastor John

In the month of April, we have been talking about the four soils. For me, it has been an exciting series and I hope it has been for you as well.

Last Sunday we were talking about the fruit of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22-23 that would be growing out of “good soil.” I mentioned that as Christians we all have all the fruit of the Spirit, and I also mentioned that we each have one of the gifts of the Spirit. Gifts and fruit are different. But each believer has one gift and some more all the way up to the nine gifts of the Spirit. But we all have the 9 fruits mentioned in Galatians 5.

On Tuesday nights for 5 weeks I am teaching a class on the “Gifts of the Holy Spirit” at Aldersgate UMC. Pastor Amy is teaching a different class at Elkton UMC on Thursday nights. Pastor Amy and I both feel privileged to be teaching these classes, as we help other people journey in learning more about the things of God.

In my class on the first night, I made a statement that we all have at least one gift of the Spirit living in us. A woman in the class asked me how we know what gift we have. I told her that she should ask God about what gift he has given to her. I also told her that sometimes we must just step out in faith and exercise the gift we feel the Spirit of God has given us. This can be frightening for sure, but I found out that God will NOT let us make a fool out of ourselves as we take a step of faith.

But in 2 Timothy 1:6 we are told to flame (or stir) up the spiritual gift that God has given you.

We are to be “stirred” up folks! I urge you to become involved in the life of our church. Sing in the choir, join the praise band, become a bell ringer, usher, greeter etc. It will make you stronger, and it will make all of us stronger. And that is what God wants from us. To be that disciple that God has called us to be. You are good soil, and you are good fruit!

As Good as Gold

April 1-7 may be Golden Rule Week, but do unto others as you would have them do unto you forevermore. While many know the Golden Rule to come from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, it may be a surprise to hear that a version of the Golden Rule appears in almost every major religion.

The Bible tells the story of how Jesus, in order to better address the great crowds following him, ascended a mountainside. His moving proclamations became known as the Sermon on the Mount. As told by his apostle Matthew, Jesus said, "So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets."

Jesus, in this teaching, was actually summarizing the Jewish Torah. Elsewhere in the Talmud, Rabbi Hillel taught, "What is hateful to yourself, do not do to another." This is a sentiment that echoes other religious teachings. The Chinese philosopher Confucius said, "Do not do to others what you would not like yourself." The Buddha preached, "Hurt not others in ways that you yourself would find hurtful." It is written in the Hindu text *Mahabharata*, "Do naught unto others what you would not have them do unto you." The Quran advises Muslims, "None of you has faith until he loves for his brother what he loves for Himself."

But there's always room for more!




Would any one like to host a "WALKING GROUP" that would walk at Bellevue (or elsewhere) once a week for six weeks?


Urban Promise loves Atonement and HOPE Church!
