

From Pastor John

Ephesians 5:25 "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her."

You may or you may not have a wife. You may or may not be a husband. You may or you may not be a wife. You may or may not be married. The part of this verse that I would like to point out is the second part of the verse, or part b. We read there that Christ loved the church and Jesus loves the church so much that he gave himself up for her; which means he died for the church.

We may or may not ever have to die for the church, but we upon joining the church were asked to live for the church! When we joined the church we made a promise to faithfully participate in its ministries by our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. (UMH Reception into the local congregation)

This letter is meant to remind us and to call attention to the vows and promise that we made when we joined the United Methodist Church of the Atonement.

We vowed and promised to faithfully participate in its ministries. Many of you are involved in the ministry here at Atonement, but some are not. There is a place for you no matter your age, your talents, or abilities. And we need many, many people to be involved in the ministries. Ask how you can be involved.

We promised to pray for the church. We should be praying for our pastor's, for our Leadership Team, for all the committees and teams that work hard to make the church what the church is. There is always a list in the bulletin for people in the need of prayer. The pastors bring names before the congregation for people that are having hardship. Perhaps ones that died and their families need our prayers. There are many, many ways we could pray for the church.

We vowed and promised to attend worship and to make our presence known by our attending worship and other meetings going on here at Atonement church. I read where in today's society people only attend church one or at the most twice a month. We have members that do much better than that. Could we do better in our attendance?

We vowed and promised to support the church with our gifts. I have always made it a practice as a layperson (you) in the church and as a pastor to give 10% off the top of my income to the church. Perhaps you continued

do that, or perhaps not. But a good question to ask is am I giving what I can to the church? Could I tithe? Could I give a larger offering? Search our hearts and our checkbooks and pray to find out this answer.

We vowed and promised to be of service to the church. This is different than its ministries. Service is in the church and outside of the church. Could we do more for our outreach? We have many, many ways that we service the community and beyond here at Atonement. Ask how you could help in service to Atonement. This is a long list!

We promised and vowed to be a witness for the church. Churches grow by people inviting people. We have ways of making it easy to invite people to Atonement church. We have invite cards that we can pass out to other people to invite them to church. If you like what is going on here at Atonement invite other people to worship here. God will love you for that! (Well God will love you anyhow)

You have a wonderful church in Atonement. It is a vibrant, and vital church, serve it well and be proud of your church. (Not in a prideful way) After all, Christ died for the church, the least we can do is live for the church!



We have a volunteer to take our filled cartons to the Collection Center at the end of collection week! A very BIG thank you!

I am still looking for people that are willing to help with the ministry during the year and also during collection week. The time commitment can be as much or as little as you are able.

Samaritan's Purse just released that starting in 2017 they will NOT allow tooth-paste or candy of any kind. Unfortunately these items have caused issues with customs in some countries and has prevented/delayed boxes from going to children in those countries. You will still be able to include toothbrushes. These items will be allowed this year but I would suggest you not include them this year either. If you need a list of item suggestions for packing your own box please see me. It is never too early to start filling a box!

For those of you that have been donating empty prescription bottles-Thank You! We want to be able to use them for small first aid kits to go in the boxes. For those, we are in need of the following donations: Nail clippers, band aids and safety pins. It would be great if we could include one in every box that we fill at our packing party in the fall so that means enough for at least 70-100 boxes. Please consider donating.

Other items for donation: toothbrushes, hair brushes and combs, T-shirts, socks, match box cars, jump ropes. Again, a more comprehensive list is available, just ask. Remember, no war themed or scary images on any of the items. What may be fun for us here in the U.S, could be frightening to a child that has no TV or internet and is not familiar with these characters.
