In conjunction with Urban Promise and Elizabeth "Joy" Kelly, a professional opera soprano, the Urban Promise Academy (Middle & High Schoolers) and Atonement Church hosted two performances of *The Essence of Dance: A U-choose Opera*. Elizabeth worked with students from the Academy for 7 weeks as an "Artist in Residence." With money from a grant for this project, the performance was accompanied by a chamber ensemble of professional musicians. On Friday, May 13 and Sunday, May 15, Urban Promise children and families along with Atonement Church supporters attended the two shows in our Sanctuary. It truly was a huge success and the young people of both the Urban Promise Academy and the Elementary School were thrilled to have this experience!









SURGE is getting ready to wrap up for this school year. Following our lock-in that we hosted on May 21st-22nd, we will only be having our youth group meetings one or two more times before the Summer begins. This is a slightly earlier end than I usually would have, but given my upcoming chaplaincy internship at Christiana Hospital for this Summer, I cannot guarantee the availability of my schedule to go much further. The lock-in was a great success, and while we weren't able to see the entire group come out for a variety of valid reasons, we had a good sized group nonetheless, and a good time was had by all. Special thanks again to all the adult volunteers that make SURGE possible each week, and especially this week to Patty Bailey and Mary Ryan's daughter Kelly, who were of great assistance to me that night. Along with all the fun and fellowship we had, we also had a great lesson on the book of Jonah, which I believe the kids benefitted a lot from, and they seemed to take a lot away from. It is times like that which make me anticipate the next school year so greatly, as I enjoy these opportunities to spend time in the Word with our youth, and to teach them not only all that I know about it, but also how we can apply and see the relevance of the Bible to our own lives. I recall quite well how much I needed these lessons when I was their age, and I can only hope that through my own experience that I can help them to receive these lessons better than I did at their age. Anyone who would like to help out with SURGE in the future, especially in the coming school year should feel free to contact me at any time, whether that's to offer up your time, to provide any food or snacks, or even to offer us opportunities to have the Youth group serve our Church or the community. These do not have to be exclusive to the next school year either, if you have any suggestions for things the youth could take part in during the Summer, I would also love to hear them, and I would even be open to anyone in the congregation taking charge of the youth in my place to do anything during this off-season.

As I previously mentioned, I will be taking place in a chaplaincy program at Christiana Hospital for the duration of the Summer months, something that will provide me with needed academic credit, important credentials as I move forward into eventually becoming ordained as a pastor, and most importantly invaluable experience in ministering to the spiritual needs of those who may be in very dark or difficult places. This program will involve roughly 30 working hours in a week, as well as a supplementary weekly overnight on-call shift, which constitutes about 16 hours. I'm greatly anticipating my time in this program, and the lessons I'll be able to

take from it as I move forward in ministry in other areas. I want to ensure our Serving Atonement has been an immense blessing for me, both in the experience it has provided, the chance to serve God it has given me, and how it has helped to provide for the costs of my education. As such, Atonement will always be my highest priority as long as I am called to serve here, and regardless of whatever responsibilities may be required of me, I will continue to faithfully serve our congregation, the congregation that has raised and nurtured me in whatever capacity is required of me, and wherever and however I am needed. I want to thank you all again for providing me this opportunity in ministry, and for bearing with me through this academically rigorous period of my education.
