PASTOR'S LETTER

Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off- for all whom the Lord our God will call." ACTS 2: 38

In the book of Acts we discover the biblical community and the fellowship of the first believers. Ephesians 2:19-20 further describes this ideal church, "...you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus Himself as the chief cornerstone."

To this fellowship of believers in the book of Acts, truth mattered: "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship...". In their fellowship was unity of focus and purpose, while they shared all that they had and took care of one another in love . Their Christian conversion was a transfer of their allegiance from the culture of legalism and religiosity to the Kingdom of God here on earth. But these first Christians did not leave Judaism because they saw themselves as Jews experiencing the fulfillment of historic promises. They were the first Messianic Jews by faith in Jesus.

Scripture goes on to say in verse 46, "They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all people. And the Lord added to their numbers daily those who were being saved." Wow! This is a pastor's dream come true! How about it, Atonement Methodist Church? It was a new era for the beginnings of Christianity. As we enter February, this second month of this New Year, may we be a reflection of this biblical community that Christ gave His life for. All to the glory of God! Amen.


of Christian Belief are found in The Apostle's Creed, which affirms God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Creed affirms belief in the church, the communion of saints, forgiveness, the resurrection of the body (Jesus' and ours), and eternal life. This creed has served the Church across centuries, and it suffices as a statement of basic Christian truth claims.

Atonement Methodist Church thrives with a clear sense of identity and purpose. We must be clear about who we are, what we believe, and what our goals are fulfilling God's Great Commandment and the Great Commission as disciples of Jesus.

Christian and Methodist Essentials are:

- 1. Sin The essence of sin is willful disobedience to the declared will of God. Sin remains the great curse of human life. Able to be restored only by a supernatural work of God.
- 2. Free Will Through God's grace, God makes it possible for us to turn from sin and accept Jesus Christ.
- 3. Justification by Faith We are made right with God by faith in Jesus Christ.
- 4. Sanctification By the power of the Holy Spirit we can experience the new birth. God will even restore the divine image within us, tarnished by sin. We should expect to experience the gift of perfect love (sanctification).
- 5. Sacraments Baptism and the Lord's Supper are means of grace, whereby the Holy Spirit empowers us and lead us into salvation.
- 6. Scripture Scripture is inspired by God to lead us into salvation. It is the true rule of Christian faith and practice, infallible in all matters related to salvation and life.



Since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you and asking God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding.

—Colossians 1:9

One of the inspiring things about the earliest churches that were following The Way (Jesus) is that they were small, tight-knit, shared much love, and were passionate about evangelism. They had a message in the Good News that was so incredible that they could not keep it to themselves. That message was about death from life, forgiveness from sin, holiness, and loving God and neighbors. I'm thankful they chose to share that Good News with the communities in which they were located, and with each other as they worshiped, broke bread together, shared what they had, and prayed fervently for each other.

When the Apostle Paul was unable to physically be with the churches he had a hand in birthing through his own evangelism and spreading the Good News, he prayed for them. And not only Paul, but those with Paul, and everyone who Paul could tell about these new gatherings of believers. When Paul prayed, it was more than, "Lord, protect them..." Paul and his companions prayed specifically that God would fill them with knowledge of God's will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding. That's a very specific prayer for these new believers who were growing in faithfulness and what it meant to leave their old lives behind and follow a man who lived, died, rose again from the dead, ascended into heaven, AND who was/is praying for them, as well. Paul constantly and consistently prayed that the believers in the churches in that region would have their minds and hearts expanded more and more so that Jesus became more and more the center of all they did and said.

In some ways, the Global Methodist Church is new and we're still learning what it means to follow Jesus together in this new way. Even more so, the Northeast Provisional Annual Conference is but a week old! What that means, specifically, is that we all need to be praying for each other, "...asking God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding." Just like the early church, we will make mistakes and things will happen slower than we want. Our churches will keep growing and learning how to be Global Methodists, as we center all we do on Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit. And, remember, Jesus is praying for us as well, as we see in John 17. By the power of prayer, we will be inspired to worship, love, and witness as agents of a holy God who loves us and wants the world to know that.

I'm praying for you! Let's go!
